

Skipping Shoes

aching ( <i>adjective</i> )	: having pain Gopu tried to find a medicine for his <b>aching</b> feet.
airy bounds ( <i>phrase</i> )	: light, delicate and bouncing steps Shipra danced gracefully with <b>airy bounds</b> .
bewitched ( <i>verb</i> )	: put under a magic spell The beauty of the Niagara Falls <b>bewitched</b> Neha.
corn-cobs ( <i>noun</i> )	: long rounded parts of the corn plant He roasted the <b>corn-cobs</b> over a charcoal fire.
errand girl ( <i>noun</i> )	: a girl who does odd jobs for somebody that involves going somewhere The <b>errand girl</b> was very quick and active.
ferns ( <i>noun</i> )	: plants with large delicate leaves and no flowers There are many types of <b>ferns</b> in the forest.
grumbled ( <i>verb</i> )	: complained My sister <b>grumbled</b> on seeing the untidy room.
hedge ( <i>noun</i> )	: a row of bushes or shrubs planted close together We found a small puppy in the <b>hedge</b> near our house.
imitate ( <i>verb</i> )	: to copy somebody Children generally try to <b>imitate</b> their elders.
knocked down ( <i>phrasal verb</i> )	: destroyed or broke something by force or mistake Shivam <b>knocked down</b> Riya's sandcastle by mistake.
lame ( <i>adjective</i> )	: unable to walk well because of an injury in the leg or foot The <b>lame</b> boy tried to walk with support.

**leaps** (*noun*) : high jumps  
The boy crossed the large field in a couple of **leaps**.

**Midsummer's Day** (*noun*): 24 June, a day associated with magical happenings  
It is believed that fairies come onto the earth on **Midsummer's Day**.

**sighed** (*verb*) : took in and then let out a deep breath which showed sadness, disappointment, tiredness, relief, etc.

I **sighed** with relief after the project was completed successfully.

**stubborn** (*adjective*) : determined not to change an opinion or attitude

The boy was **stubborn** and did not listen to his mother's advice.

**thud** (*noun*) : a sound made when a heavy object hits something

The box fell on the floor with a loud **thud**.

**trotting** (*verb*) : moving fast but not at full speed

I saw a horse **trotting** on my uncle's farm.

**twirled** (*verb*) : moved and danced round and round

Neha **twirled** gracefully during the performance.

**waltzed** (*verb*) : danced

Ritu **waltzed** happily around the house in her new dress.

**whined** (*verb*) : complained in an annoying, crying voice

The little girl **whined** about her broken toy.

**whisked** (*verb*) : took somebody/something somewhere very quickly

Charu **whisked** the boxes into her room so cleverly that no one realised what she was doing.

**zipped away** (*phrasal verb*) : rushed off speedily

Jim **zipped away** on his bicycle to reach on time.
