



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

There are three main kinds of nouns.

- 1. Common Nouns
- 2. Proper Nouns
- 3. Collective Nouns



English A

- Common nouns are the names given to things, places or people which are of same kind. Examples: boy, girl, river, table
- Proper nouns are the names of particular persons, places, animals or things. Proper nouns are always written in capital letters. Examples: Ram, Seema, Taj Mahal
- Collective nouns are the names of groups of people, animals or things taken as one unit. Examples: group, army, team




